STAGES OF TONAL DEVELOPMENT AND RHYTHM DEVELOPMENT

Although all children develop at different rates, most children progress through a similar sequence before reaching basic music competence.

TONAL DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Your child sings songs utilizing mostly one pitch. This is the note that is easiest for his or her vocal chords to produce.
- 2. Your child sings songs going up when the melody goes up, and going down when the melody goes down. The notes he/she sings are not the exact notes of the song but the up and down pitch of notes are in the right direction.
- 3. Your child sings parts of a song correctly. Usually the parts done correctly are the very beginning or very end of a song.
- 4. Your child sings most of a song in tune.
- 5. Your child sings entire songs in tune.

RHYTHM DEVELOPMENT

- 1. Your child moves to music in an irregular way.
- 2. Your child moves or sings with a consistent tempo. That tempo is the child's own pace and is usually different than the tempo of the music.
- 3. Your child's movements often coincide to the beat of the music. He or she sings parts of songs in the correct tempo and meter.
- 4. Your child's movements always coincide to the beat of the music. Your child sings entire songs in the correct tempo and meter.
